"Copyright protection ... is not available for any work of the United States Government." 17 U.S.C. § 105

(not state/municipal government)

CC0

"No Rights Reserved"



CC0 enables scientists, educators, artists and other creators and owners of copyrightor database-protected content to waive those interests in their works and thereby place them as completely as possible in the public domain, so that others may freely build upon, enhance and reuse the works for any purposes without restriction under copyright or database law.

• US copyright law



Works published prior to 1924 are probably PD



Works published after 1989 are probably *not* PD



Works published outside the US can get tricky

Unpublished works

Never Published, Never Registered Works²

Kinda published works

"General publication"

- Sold in stores, available in libraries
- Made available to the public regardless of who they are or their intended use
- = published, use rules for published works

"Limited publication"

- Only available through public performance or exhibition
- Made available to a limited group for a limited purpose ("Do not Distribute")
- = unpublished, use rules for unpublished works

Where? (foreign publication check)

For most of 20th century, US protection required compliance with US formalities

1991 – US passes a copyright amendment to fix this Resulting in us "copyright restoration" for many works that were previously in the US public domain
