Embedded librarian partnered with the English faculty member who teaches the majority of our required English composition courses

Multi-Modal Presentations

- ▶ Involves the use of more than one mode of communication
 - Words
 - ▶ Images
 - Sound
 - Graphic design
- Requires use of presentation software such as PowerPoint, Prezi, etc.
- Used more and more as an assignment format
 - Intended to prepare students to give professional presentations and design patient education materials
 - Incorporated as a required assignment in all English composition courses

Copyright Concerns

- Students heavy use of copyright protected materials
- ▶ Lack of understanding of copyright
- ► Faculty desire to put selected multi-modal presentations in a public venue (YouTube, Facebook, etc.)

Reasons for Copyright Instruction

- ► ACRL framework includes as an outcome that students "[f]ollow ethical and legal guidelines in gathering and using information"
- College core curriculum outcomes include ethical use of information
- Student use of copyright protected materials made it clear that instruction regarding copyright should be an integral part of teaching students to prepare a multi-modal presentation
- ▶ The English faculty member with whom I was partnered agreed



Learning Outcomes

- ▶ Basic understanding of copyright
 - A lot of what is on the Internet is protected by copyright
 - Can doesn't mean may
- Familiarity with and ability to use tools to find materials that can be used without concern about copyright infringement
- Properly providing attribution when required by a license

Expectations regarding Copyright

- Images, music, and video in presentation must be created by the student, be in the public domain, or have a license that permits use (Creative Commons, Pixabay, etc.)
- Appropriate attribution with embedded URL must be provided for all resources used

Alternative to Multimodal Presentation

- Require students to incorporate appropriate and relevant supporting images in an essay or research paper
- Provide copyright attribution as required by documentation style used








Instruction: Using Filters in Google/Bing Images
